2022 IMA Intermission Museum of Art in collaboration with Slovenian artist Neja Tomšič on a project that will be shared online through the museum in early 2022, a real life presentation will take place later in the year, consolidating the work of 4 collaborations. IMA is a project developed by John Ros (New York) and Rose van Mierlo (Deventer) intermission museum of art (ima) was founded in 2020 in response to the cultural, social, environmental, economic and political fissures that make themselves evermore present during times of crisis and put stress on accepted systems of operation. ima provides a space for critical thinkers to respond to these moments of friction by investigating them as meaningful sites of production, instigating dialogues which will culminate in a public archive; collaborative responses will be organised around themes, and though they exist on their own (as editions), they co-exist as larger ideas (in volumes).
